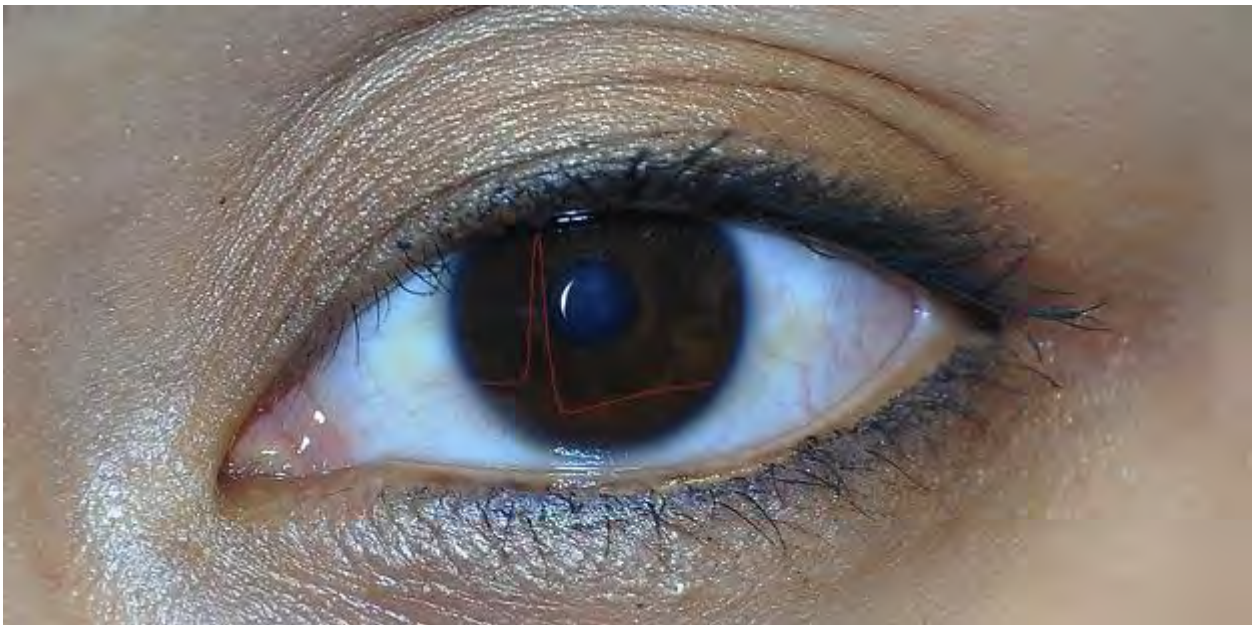


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Introduction

The Structure of a Postgraduate Thesis Programme

Masters Thesis

Students are engaged in full-time research for 12 months which culminates in the production of a thesis. Information on University policy relating to the MSc thesis can be obtained [here](#).

PhD Course

The University expects, as a norm, that a PhD will take three years of full-time study to complete. Information on the PhD qualification can be obtained [here](#).

Acceptance into a Postgraduate Thesis Programme

MSc Thesis

A grade point average of at least a B+ in first year MSc, PGDipSci or BSc(Hons) or equivalent is required.

Masters Thesis student entry into the Department

The following documents must be emailed to the supervisor(s) you are interested in working with (see our [400-level booklet](#) on our website for an indication of the research projects available):

- CV
- Academic transcript (and, if applicable, an explanation of the content)
- Evidence of English language proficiency (if not already a University of Otago student)
- Statement describing why you wish to study for a Masters thesis at the University of Otago
- Indication of start date for MSc if your application is successful
- The names and email addresses of two referees (only required if student has not taken their 400-

level studies in the Department).

If your application is to be considered further, you will be contacted by the prospective supervisor to discuss the next stage (this includes writing a one-page MSc proposal). If selected as suitable for acceptance into our MSc programme, you will then be given information on how to formally apply to the University for admission.

PhD Thesis

BSc (Hons) at the 2.1 level so long as they contain a significant research component (e.g. an Honours dissertation). Alternatively, one-year 120-point MSc thesis (i.e. 2nd year MSc) or a PGDipSci (60-point thesis) with a B+ grade average is acceptable, however, much higher grades are required to secure scholarships.

PhD student entry into the Department

The following documents must be emailed to the supervisor(s) you are interested in working with (see our [PhD Programme page](#) on our website for an indication of the research projects available):

- Your name and country of citizenship
- Your CV
- Academic transcript (and, if applicable, an explanation of the content)
- Evidence of English language proficiency
- The names and email addresses of two referees
- An indication of research interest(s) and staff member(s) with whom you are interested in studying
- Indication of start date for PhD if your application is successful

If your application is to be considered further, you will be contacted by a prospective supervisor as soon as possible to discuss the next stage (this includes writing a one-page PhD proposal). If selected as suitable for acceptance into PhD programme, you will then be given information on how to formally apply to the University for admission.

Scholarship funding

There are a number of scholarships available for students to study at the University of Otago, however all prospective students must apply to the Department first for admission into each programme. There are very few scholarships for international Masters students.

The Department of Physiology also offers departmental scholarships for Masters (\$13,000 + domestic fees for 12 months) and PhD (\$25,000 per year + fees for 3 years), as well as stipends of lower value.

Note that students receiving University scholarships may not accept employment for more than 10 hours per week, on average across a period of 12 months, without prior permission from the Scholarships Committee on behalf of the Board of Graduate Studies.
